Practical Nursing

Program Outlook:

- This program provides classroom and related instruction and required skills to qualify the student for entry level employment in health care. Clinical experience is provided at local hospitals and selected health-care facilities. The curriculum is designed to prepare the students to take and pass the National Council Licensure Exam-Practical Nurse (NCLEX-PN) prior to seeking employment as a licensed practical nurse (LPN).

Program Content:

- Medical, surgical, obstetric, pediatric, and geriatric nursing
- Acute care, long term care, and community settings
- Personal, family, and community health concepts
- Nutrition
- Human growth and development over the life span
- Body structure and functions
- Diseases and disorders
- Administration of medications
- Legal aspects of practice
- Employability skills



Industry Certification:

- National Council Licensure Exam-Practical Nurse (NCLEX-PN)

Length of Program:

- This program is 1350 hours in length (approx. 14 months) with 675 hours of clinical experience, which includes practicing program skills with a human patient simulator. Open-entry/open-exit is not applicable.

Entrance Requirements:

- Application
 - Interview with a counselor and department head
 - Physical examination
 - Submit required level of background check
 - Attend orientation
 - Admission Test: Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)
 - Assessment in math, language, and reading
 - Official transcript of high school diploma or GED required
 - Adult students must be at least 16 years old and not attending high school
 - Uniform required
- Financial aid is available for those who qualify.
